#### PURPOSE

• To provide an avenue to explore and bring awareness to the auction industry. This contest aims to shine a spotlight on the rich traditions and valuable bid-calling skills associated with the auction industry, promoting its significance as an industry that not only fosters commercial transactions, but also serves as a vibrant platform for verbal and interactive communication.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- **Skill Demonstration:** To offer participants the opportunity to showcase their bid-calling abilities in a competitive environment, encouraging them to hone their techniques and fluency.
- **Industry Exposure:** To introduce and familiarize young individuals with the broader aspects of the auction industry, including its history, significance, and career opportunities.
- **Communication Development:** To understand the importance of verbal and interactive communication skills. Through active participation and feedback, contestants will learn the value of clarity, confidence, and engagement in the art of auctioneering.
- **Networking:** To connect participants with industry veterans, mentors, and peers, fostering relationships that could guide them should they choose a path in the auction industry.
- Education: While the contest emphasizes skill and professionalism, it also seeks to create an environment where participants can learn, be inspired, and most importantly, enjoy the fast-paced environment of the auction industry.

### ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- Contestants shall dress appropriately in Official Dress.
- The event is open to students who are in 8<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> grades who are active members of Oklahoma FFA Chapters that are in good standing with the state association and national organization.
- Contestants must be registered by January 15, 2024 in order to compete
- The contestant is required to bring 2 items to sell during the contest which will be conducted in a live auction setting. The funds raised during the qualifying event will benefit the Oklahoma State Auctioneers Association (OSAA). The funds raised during the state contest will benefit the Oklahoma FFA Foundation.
- Photos of items must be submitted by January 25, 2024.

## ATTENDANCE

- All contestants must attend a mandatory Contestant Roll Call and Orientation Meeting on the day of the contest. Roll call will begin promptly at the beginning of the meeting. In the event a contestant is not present during the initial roll call, their name will be called two additional times at 10-minute intervals. In the event a contestant is not present when their name is called the third and final time, they will be disqualified from the contest.
- Contestants shall be introduced by contestant number in both the qualifying and state contest. If the contestant is not present when called to the stage, he or she will be disqualified.

#### CONTEST STRUCTURE

- Competing order will be determined prior to the event by a drawing conducted by the OSAA Board of Directors and will be posted one week prior to the contest.
- The sound system will be pre-set and will not be adjusted for any individual during the contest.
- There will be three to five judges for the qualifying contest. These judges will be comprised of Auctioneer Champions. Judges for the state contest will be determined by collaboration of the OSAA Board, National Auction Association (NAA) Representative, and FFA Leadership.
- If a conflict between a judge and contestant has been determined by the OSAA Board or NAA Representative, a replacement judge will be determined by the OSAA Board Chairman.

- In the event a judge cannot complete his/her duties during the qualifying and/or state contest round of the contest, an alternate judge will replace that judge.
- Contestants shall be introduced by contestant number in both the qualifying and state contest. If the contestant is not present when called to the stage, he or she will be disqualified.
- Each contestant sells two items consecutively in both the qualifying and state championship rounds. Contestants will sell the items they, themselves, provided for the contest.
- The contestant will be selling in a live auction setting to real buyers for real money. The contestant is responsible for knowing the amount each item sold for and the bidder number of the winning bidder.
- Family, friends, and advisors are welcome to attend the contest, register for a bidder number, and purchase items in the auction throughout the contest.

## JUDGING AND SCORING

- On the scorecard used for the qualifying round, the total possible points in each category will be as follows:
  - Professionalism 20 points
  - Chant/Voice 45 points
  - Effective Auctioneering 35 points
- On the scorecard used for the state contest round, the total possible points in each of the categories will be as follows:
  - Professionalism 10 points
  - Chant/Voice 25 points
  - Effective Auctioneering 25 points
  - Interview 40 points
- The lowest scores will be eliminated, and the remaining scores will be averaged for the contestants' final scores.
- If a tie score occurs in either the qualifying or state contest portion of the competition, scores will be recalculated to include the contestant's low score. In the event there is still a tie, the contestant with the highest score in the Chant/Voice category will be selected. If necessary, the third tiebreaker would go to the contestant with the highest score in the Effective Auctioneering category.
- The scores from the qualifying round determine who will go on to the state contest. Scores will reset for the state contest round.

- The top 10 contestants will be announced at the completion of the qualifying round and these contestants will compete at the state contest on **May 7**, **2024** at the **Oklahoma FFA Convention**.
- All 10 state contest competitors will be asked a pre-published interview question prior to selling their two auction items during the state round of the contest.
- Only state contest competitors will interview. Contestants will have up to two
  minutes to answer the question. Responses will be timed. Contestants are not
  penalized if they do not use the entire two minutes to answer the interview
  question.
- Winners of the FFA Auctioneering CDE will be announced at the end of the state contest round at the Oklahoma FFA Convention.
